Dear Parents and Community Members:

We are pleased to present you with the Annual Education Report (AER), which provides key information on the 2024-2025 educational progress for Pioneer High School. The AER addresses the complex reporting information required by federal and state laws. The school's report contains information about student assessment, accountability, and teacher quality. For the 2025-26 school year, schools were identified based on previous years' performance using definitions and labels as required in the Every Student Succeeds Act (ESSA). A Targeted Support and Improvement (TSI) school is one that had at least one underperforming student group in 2024-25. An Additional Targeted Support (ATS) school is one that had at least one student group performing at the same level as the lowest 5% of all schools in the state in 2021-22. A Comprehensive Support and Improvement (CSI) school is one whose performance was in the lowest 5% of all schools in the state, had a graduation rate at or below 67%, failed to exit CSI status in 2024-25, or failed to exit ATS status in 2021-22. Some schools are not identified with any of these labels. In these cases, no status label is given.

Pioneer High School has not been given one of these labels.

Pioneer High School offers support to entering students to help them fulfill graduation requirements. The program includes online coursework and tutoring services to assist students in completing their academic courses. Assessments are conducted to identify areas of concern, allowing for tailored instructional strategies to meet each student's individual needs.

PROCESS FOR ASSIGNING PUPILS TO THE SCHOOL

Students are selected to attend Pioneer High School if they have an identified academic need or require additional support beyond the traditional middle and high school settings. Enrollment may also be offered to students who benefit from a nontraditional schedule and need to participate in virtual courses.
